Minutes of Meeting for

January 11, 2022

After the pledge, Chairman Jimmy Allred brought the meeting to order. Ann Hamilton started the public comment by stating Frank Reid wants the Town Council to contact MaryAnn Sharp in Preston who works for the state and have her come to a meeting and ask her why the speed limit signs haven't been put up. Jimmy mentioned that they are supposed to come and put them up in the spring. Ann also mentioned that Frank wants the DOT to snow plow outside of the white line on the road, however, that is dirt and it won't plow.

Lorin Peacock suggested making a shooting range here in the White River Valley. He has already spoke with Jared Bybee at the BLM who told him to take it to the correct channels, which is the Town Council and then the County Commission. Would need to pay for covering and shooting bench. Short pistol range at 50 yards and then every 100 yards up to 1,000 for long range. Would like BLM to do dirt work and suggested the bench of the Egan range or the Douglas range mountains. Lee Ringueberg asked Lorin to talk to the commissioners, they will work on getting him on the agenda.

Candice Perez asked for \$350 for the annual Lund Easter Egg Hunt which will be held on April 9th, 2022. Was told to keep receipts.

Gilbert Griffin asked if we don't put up the LED speed limit signs soon will we lose the budget? Also wanted to talk about the whole town clean up concept. Talked about a recycling center he seen in South Carolina, maybe an acre or less, there were dumpsters for different items, maybe 5 in total. This gives people a close option to clean up their place. Also Panaca has something similar. Jimmy mentioned that Panaca has their own dump, which is hauled to a landfill. What options are there for us or those who want to clean up their property/town? Jimmy mentioned he has spoke with Bill @ the County and he said its too expensive to have dumpsters dropped off and picked up like we did last year. Gilbert asked if there is any grant money or funds for community beautification. Jimmy said that is something to look into. Ann suggested maybe writing letters to different counties/places and seeing what they do. Gilbert mentioned that what if the town council paid for for trailer load once a week or once a month? If the town clean up is a priority to the town council, if we have money can we use it?

Lee Ringueberg made a motion to approve the minutes of October 12, 2021 as written, Ann Hamilton seconded that motion and all members approved.

Vouchers for payment, Easter budget for Candice Perez, secretary wages motioned by Lee and seconded by Ann. All members approved.

Lee mentioned the street light in front of the Pierce residence flickers on and off. Also the stop sign heading up to the school is missing, she called the county today to have them replace it. Ann mentioned the street by the Lund Garage needs the trees trimmed in front of the stop sign. Jimmy is going to talk to John Rimington about getting those cleared.

Rod McKenzie sent a thank you to the Town Council for sending flowers in remembrance of Carol McKenzie and her many wonderful years of service.
