

LUND TOWN COUNCIL
MINUTES FOR MAY 14 2019

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Jim Allred at 6pm. After a short discussion regarding last meeting of April 9, 2019 Lee Ringueberg made a motion to approve the minutes as written and Ann Hamilton seconded that motion and all board members approved.

No one from the Lund Rodeo Assoc was present so there is nothing to report. One voucher was presented for payment, Lee made a motion to approve secretary's voucher for payment and Christina Rimington seconded it and all members approved.

Sandy McGowan was present to give a White River Museum update. They are working with Great Basin Heritage Board to gain information about grants that could be beneficial to our area. Sandy will report back when more details are available.

Ann reported that there were several abandoned buildings in the area and would like to see them eliminated for safety reasons as well as to clean up properties around town. After some discussion regarding some properties and several questions need to be researched. The board was in favor of this process, so Ann will get more procedure information and give the board an update at the next meeting.

No one from the local or county fire departments were present. Jim reported that there was to be a county fire meeting May 20, 2019 and he encourages everyone to be there. The Council received an email from Nicole Baldwin stating the White Pine County Fire Commissioners would like to meet with Lund Town Council and answer questions and discuss any concerns. They will be present at the next meeting June 11, 2019.

Jim and the board requested a letter be written to Verizon, our area's cellular service provider, and inform them of the terrible and lack of cellular service. All members agreed that any thing may be helpful to let Verizon know this is not acceptable. Jim is still to meet with Mt. Wheeler Power representatives to try and get the street light at the north of town replaced to the original status with a street light. Jim also reported that in the near future lighted speed limit signs will be put up at the north and south ends of Main street on Highway 318.

As for public comment, several residents reported their concerns regarding Fire and EMS protection for our area. Many questions were: Is there any Fire and EMS coverage?

How long will be the response time?

Who will be responsible?

How does this all affect our home insurance?

Why don't all taxpayers get the same priorities?

Why do the rural communities always have to put up with poor service, poor representation, lack of county concern and still have to pay more than most taxpayers?

Lee made a motion to adjourn, Lance Matheson seconded that motion and all members approved. The next scheduled meeting will be June 11 2019 6pm @ Lund Community Bldg.
